

#### Supplement to Tool Handle Turing Demo

#### To drill and tap the mild steel bar:

- 1. Drill a starter hole gently to keep the hole in the center of the tool bar stock use a 1/16<sup>th</sup> inch bit with most of the bit recessed in the drill chuck. Remember to start back from the front edge of the stock to drill the hole. The excess can be removed from the front after the treaded hole is complete and you have drilled the 27/64<sup>th</sup> inch hole for the Easy Wood Tool (EWT) Round Cutter.
- 2. For a 6-32 tread tap, use a 7/16 inch bit to drill the hole for the tap. If you desire to use a larger screw (Alan Wrench, Phillips screw or even a Torx Screw), drill the appropriate size hole and then tap the hole.
- 3. Using a High Speed Steel Tap and using Cutting Oil (available at Big R as well as other stores), proceed to tap the hole all the way through. Use care and only as much force to turn the tape slightly and the back off to a smooth area.
- 4. Once the screw hole is tapped, drill the 27/64<sup>th</sup> drill bit to drill down enough so the EWT round cutter will fit level with the bar.
- 5. Once the 27/64<sup>th</sup> hole is drilled, remove the excess material from the front of the bar until you have the bar recessed back from the edge of the cutter. Also, taper the front of the bar so there will not be material on the bar to rub on the wood when cutting the wood.
- 6. If necessary, remove any of the screw that protrudes through the tapped hole to eliminate rubbing on the wood when turning. Be sure to install the cutter in the bar; then, grind off the excess screw. Remove the screw and then reinstall to ensure it fits properly.
