
Ed Austin – June 17th

Turning a Twig Pot with Insert



Mr. Ed talked to us about his Twig Pot Demo in the beginning and discussed that he had four pieces of green birch to allow for his demo and for three folks to come up and give it a try. He covered the fact that he pre-drilled the one inch holes in the stock using a Morse Taper Drill Bit.

Also he had turned a tenon on the birch blanks.



Then Ed made us ware of a sanding kit that contained a number of sanding blocks that were shaped in a variety of shapes that are instrumental in sanding the nooks and cranny's we all encounter in woodturning.



Ed commenced the turning by shaping the blank into a cylinder and then used his set of Easy Wood Tools (EWT).



Once the twig pot was shaped to his liking, he parted it off and then remounted it using the one inch drill bit as a jam chuck.



After mounting it on the drill bit, he finished the bottom of the pot and did some sanding.



This is the finished product. Notice that Ed put detail on the pot using the diamond EWT. He then inserted the one inch glass tube in the pot which allows for putting in real flowers with water.



Ed then invited members of the audience to come up and experience what he just demonstrated. The only taker was Roger Wayman who gladly took advantage to turn a twig pot.



He used Ed's EWT to shape the pot.



When the pot was shaped to his liking, he removed it from the lathe with the tenon intact so he could take it home and sand it to completion.

Shop Tip – Tom Krajacich

Weight Lifting and Segmenting:

If you have some exercise equipment lying around, this might be one use for it. Exercise is primary, but when you are not using it for this intended purpose, segmented woodturning should be considered.

have made Now that you your segmented rings and are assembling them into that beautiful platter or bowl, here are some simple suggestions. If you try to clamp the rings right away after gluing, they have a tendency to slide/move. Glue is cheap and you need to use enough for good glue joints. Glue is slippery. If you glue the rings and do the rubbing of the segmented rings together for assembly to uniformly spread the glue(Rich Charlson's teaching), and then leave them for about 5-10 minutes they tack up and then you can clamp them or weight them so they don't move/slide(Terry Hill suggestion).

Clamping has to be equal pressure around the ring so it isn't pulled in any one direction. With weighting, make sure the segmented ring is on a level surface, otherwise the ring will be in place, and then the next time you check on your ring's progress you will find that it has slid over and is no longer centered (Don't ask me why I know this). You don't need a lot of weight for this purpose—5-10 pounds is adequate (see picture).



The weight method places uniform downward pressure on the ring until the glue has set up. Either clamping or weighting allows for good glue joints. Hope this shop suggestion helps. **Happy Turning**. Tom Krajacich
