June Club Demo

The GFWT Club was back in the shop on 7/13/2021 for an excellent demo on making an Angel Wing Christmas Ornament by Larry Harmon. Larry said he started to making these Christmas ornaments a number of years ago and has refined them over that time. I believe that he said he got the idea from the Woodturning Design magazine from December 2012. The author of that article



was Larry Marley. Mr. Marley said he was inspired to make the wings and halos based on the work of Hans Weissflog from Germany. This presentation focused on the wings of this ornament. Larry noted that the basic idea is to cut some wing shapes and mount them to a sacrificial wooden face plate such as melamine, MDF or plywood. The placement of the wings is off set on the face plate. Double sided tape is used for this purpose of attachment. The thickness of the wings is about 3/16" to ½ ". The idea is to cut a series of grooves halfway

through the stock, and then flip and remount them to cut the stock on a different axis halfway through on that side. Larry made an ingenuous wooden cover for his very small parting tool to help cut these grooves to the right depth. A mark on the tool or tape can be your depth gauge. Cut too deep and the wing

left and right orientation for placement of these wings. This helps avoid making two left or two right wings and therefore not having the pair of wings for the ornament. The body of the ornament is turned from a 2'x6' block of your choice of hardwood. Larry had already prepared a body prior



comes apart. He did note that it is vey easy to break these delicate wings. He also makes a round halo using the same groove cutting technique. Using a chisel to very gently pry the halos or wings off the waste block/sacrificial face plate is to this demonstration. As noted, his presentation was about the making of these delicate halos and wings. Because of the complexity of this project, I have taken the liberty of citing Mr. Marley's article for a better write up than I could accomplish. That article shows dimensions and shapes for the body, halo and wings. It also shows the groove pattern for the front and back side of the halos and wings. Larry then showed us how he mounts the halo and wings on the body of the Christmas ornament using Titebond II wood glue in the three holes(halo and 2 wings). The Christmas ornament can either stand or have a hanger installed for hanging of the ornament. A very nice presentation with a very cool end- product. Since this was Larry's first demonstration for the GFWT Club he got a woodturner's T-Shirt. Please consider doing a demo and get yourself a T-Shirt.
